The SkyTeam alliance offers an extensive network throughout Africa. SkyTeam airlines serve destinations across Africa with excellent connections from Europe and nonstop service to the continent from Greater China, Asia, the United States and the Middle East. Within Africa, SkyTeam member Kenya Airways operates a comprehensive network of flights to 52 destinations in 42 countries. SkyTeam is the second largest airline alliance in Africa, a growth market with great potential.
